New project: Dental care for children with ASD

PenCRU are excited to be leading the involvement of families in a new project with the Peninsula Dental School (Plymouth University). This project builds on significant interest from families about oral health and dentistry. The project aim is to:

Identify key strategies to improve access to general dental care for children with autism spectrum disorders in the prevention of dental caries (tooth decay).

"I am a Dental Hygienist and a mother of a three year old son with additional needs associated with autism. It isn't until you experience something first hand that you can truly understand the struggles of others; only now being a parent of a child with additional needs can I fully empathise with how oral hygiene is one of the big challenges parents of ASD children have to face with personal care. I personally feel there is a lot that can be improved in general dental services for children with ASD and this will hopefully be a great starting point to making those changes".
