Welcome and introductions

Points from last meeting:

- KA was going to pass on contact details to CL to follow up
- CL to contact SALT at DHR.

Annual Event

- Concerns have been raised about the steepness of the paths at the Dartmoor Zoo venue.
- MM to ask other students to volunteer to help out on the day, also Andrew
- AE suggested using our posters in the room we will be based in, possibly have Post-it notes available for families to comment or make suggestions

- RT knows of another mime if Vinnie is unavailable.

Project Updates

Communication

Website – update due, possibility of each study having individual page

Action: SB to coordinate

• Twitter – general discussion around the use of Twitter to raise our profile. Considered to be more aimed at professionals than families

Action: SB to set up account

 RT suggested that a PenCRU Facebook page is started in addition to a Twitter account; general agreement from group, BM mentioned families more likely to use Facebook however need to be cautious and look into possibility of closed page

Action: SB to look into having a closed page on Facebook

• Merits of getting involved in BBC Radio Devon programmes discussed, and generally thought that this does reach a wide audience. RT has contacts.

Involvement update

Update on Children's Faculty

- First meeting has taken place, off to a good start but there are some issues we need to consider particularly around communication.
- Group discussed the possibility that parents would be discouraged from participating in meetings to give the children more chance to answer for themselves.
- It is an option to visit children in schools and other regular young people's settings; they may be more comfortable in a familiar environment.
- BM suggested that Pathfield School in North Devon might have some helpful advice about how to engage children in contributing to decisions

Integrating working Groups

- Holding working groups in other locations_had been tried with a meeting in Barnstaple –
 limited in that often a lot of the meeting tends to be dedicated to introduction/catch up.
- It may be better to change the focus of regional groups from a particular issue to a more general discussion.
- RT and GH asked for suggestions for ways we could increase awareness of these working groups among professionals in North Devon and other locations.

GH to let us know about lead therapists in these areas.

Seminars and Lectures

- Talks involving practical tips would be more useful than general academic topics; everyone enjoyed Brahm's talk and would like to hear him speak on other topics.
- The possibility of John Shaw coming again to do another talk was discussed, and might be worthwhile if the focus is on what integration means rather than the general ICS service talk.
- AE expressed interest to receive slides from Brahm Norwich talk

Action: CMc ask Cath to send to AE

 GH suggested a talk/ half day seminar on sleep, with the possibility of Bryony Berresford speaking about the SPRU research on this topic. Could also invite commissioners and various local sleep practitioners

Action: CM to follow up

Co-chairs for meetings

• The possibility of who should chair meetings was discussed, perhaps a parent. Everyone was happy for CM to continue to chair meetings.

Any other business

• GH – Para-Olympic team from Ghana will be coming to Exeter from 20th June to mid August. There are opportunities for local children with disabilities to get involved either watching their training sessions, or for the team to visit schools to train. Other opportunities involve the team getting involved with local radio programmes.

Action: GH to send details to CMc.

- Communication in Hospitals update from CL. Still having difficulties with recruitment of children to interview. It may be possible to recruit from wards – ethics are to be consulted.
 Action: GH will pass on details for school nurse at Vranch House.
- AE raised two possible research questions: effectiveness of hemispherectomy for young children – quality of life and effect on seizures. Prevalence of ASD among other conditions (comorbidity). Was given forms to submit
